



The 2009 Skate Canada Achievement Awards

Skate Canada Competitive Coach Award of Excellence

The Skate Canada Competitive Coach Award of Excellence will be presented to one individual at the Skate Canada Achievement Awards Gala. Nominations should be sent to the Section by a currently registered member of Skate Canada, which includes athletes, coaches, officials, clubs and members of the Section or National Board of Directors. The Section should forward all nomination forms to the National Office. Skate Canada reserves the right to not present this award in any given year. This award is given to a professional coach who provides coaching excellence to athletes within Skate Canada's Competitive Skate program, who displays dedication to continuing education and the sport in general.

Criteria:

- An active professional coach who is currently registered with Skate Canada with a minimum NCCP Level II certification;
- The individual has coached skaters at at least one national* (or international) event in the competitive season in which the award is presented (i.e. 2008-2009);
- A professional coach who moves beyond coaching as a profession and contributes to the development of skating globally through a *professional or volunteer* commitment (e.g. committee member, course conductor, seminar leader, guest speaker, etc.);
- A coach who is keen to share accurate information with officials, athletes, coaches, parents and administrators with the interest/intent of developing figure skating and figure skaters in Canada; and
- A coach who has shown commitment to professional development through continued upgrading of qualifications.

*National events include BMO Skate Canada Challenges, BMO Skate Canada Junior Nationals, BMO Canadian Figure Skating Championships, BMO Skate Canada Synchronized Championships, Regional Festival of Synchronized Skating and the HomeSense STARSkate Championships.

The Skate Canada Chairman of the Board, Chair of the Advisory Coaching Council, Director, Coaching and Skating Programs and the Competitive Coaching Programs Manager will select the winner.
