Chairman's Report

Four years have flown by and we have seen a lot of changes in our Organization, most notably the introduction of the Cumulative Points Calculation System, which has driven many of the projects we have undertaken. We have embraced the CPC system and are forging ahead with its implementation.

Athlete Development

Skate Canada PEI got the season off to a running start for 31 skaters who participated in the Talent Identification session with Canadian Champion and Olympian Karen Preston. Karen also offered a one day Fall Youth Camp with 14 skaters participating. Our competitive skaters experienced their first competition on the Island in the CPC judging system at Sectionals in Crapaud. After some initial setup challenges, things ran smoothly and the event was a success. We offered a PeeWee and Pre-Juvenile Ladies event, for the first time in many years and had 5 skaters compete in their first Sectionals in the PeeWee Ladies B event. In December, six skaters traveled to Moncton for Eastern Challenge where most improved dramatically on their Sectionals scores. Our Skater Development Chair continued to offer opportunities to our skaters with Competitive Club held six times throughout the winter in Crapaud. The highlight of the season for two Pre-Novice competitors, Denise Davison and Lindsay Richardson; two Novice skaters Rachael Macaulay and Isabelle Keeler; and one Special Olympian Alyssa Chapman was Canada Games in Whitehorse, Yukon. Our skaters all performed well, achieving personal bests and did our Province proud. The skaters were accompanied by Head Coach Julie McNeill, Assistant Michelle Coach, Apprentice Krista MacKay, Special Olympics coach Kim Duffy and Team Manager Barb Mayhew. Congratulations to all on a job well done.

Once again registration in our Provincial STARSkate competition increased and Pownal Figure Skating Club did an admirable job of hosting the event in conjunction with the Provincial Synchronized Skating Championships. Emma Waite was the only qualifying competitor who made the trip to the National STARSkate held in Calgary, Alberta in March and became the first PEI STARSkater to be judged under the CPC system.

We are currently in discussions with the other Atlantic Provinces to resurrect Skate Atlantica, which skaters will qualify to attend through our Section STARSkate event. Details are being worked out and we hope to have further information later in the summer.

At the CANSkate and Junior level, Kensington and Area Skating Club continued its long tradition of hosting the ADL Junior Championships with competitors from all 13 clubs across the Island participating. Interclub was hosted by Summerside Figure Skating Club and O'leary held the Friendship Synchro event.

Our Recreational Chair was busy organizing seminars for the STARSkaters, starting with a dance seminar conducted by Rob Fraser and freeskate with Angela Coady and Amy Ouellette. Both were well received by those in attendance. Once again the Section organized bringing in a male dance partner, Ed Bahoric to partner our skaters in their Junior Silver to Gold level dances. Lessons were also offered for Diamond Dances by Bahoric and Rob Fraser offered lessons for Senior Bronze dances.

Synchronized skaters and coaches were also treated to a seminar on the CPC system and the coaches agreed it was an invaluable experience.

Human Resource Development

New Brunswick Section offered a training session for skaters and coaches on the CPC judging system with Michael Slipchuk and the Section subsidized attendance for coaches and competitive skaters. Barb Moase was chosen to attend a National Seminar for Accountants on the CPC system and is one of only 28 across the country to be so trained. She is now qualified to train our Accountants and to run the CPC system at the Sectionals level. Our Accountants handled the challenge well and used CPC for our Sectionals event. Things went off without a hitch. Great job gang!

Sport PEI offered sessions on Long Term Athlete Development which were attended by a few of our coaches and myself. Kim Duffy was invited by Skate Canada to attend its own LTAD Summit in April. For the first time, Skate Canada has also invited Skater Development Chair, Lisa Frizzell to attend the National Youth Camp, which is the weekend of May 4-5 in Ottawa. This will be an opportunity for her to garner information from other Sections as well as top level coaches.

Our coaches continue with their professional development and together with Shannon Richards, a skills seminar was held to discuss standards and expectations. Shannon has remarked that the skills tests have improved since this seminar.

Thank you to all the accountants and judges who gave of their time tirelessly again this season so that our skaters would be able to achieve their goals and have some fun!

Organizational Development

In an effort to bring some fresh ideas to the Section, we started off the current season with a Think Tank at the AGM in Slemon Park last May. Some great ideas came out of the sessions and we attempted to implement as many of them as possible. Thank you to all the coaches, parents, board members and skaters who attended.

Continuing the emphasis on CANSkate and the Chairman's Challenge, Skate Canada PEI funded an advertisement in the Journal Pioneer and Guardian of registration dates and contacts for all clubs in the fall. We also offered funding of \$150 to each club to assist with the purchase of learning tools and other items to enhance their CANSkate programs.

Sherwood Parkdale accepted the Chairman's challenge and more than doubled their CANSkate enrollment jumping from 60 members in 2006 to 124 in 2007. Congratulations on a great job!

Partner Development

The PEI Provincial Government continues to be a strong supporter of amateur sport on PEI and is a major financial supporter of Skate Canada PEI. We are extremely fortunate to have some terrific event sponsors as well. Special mention must be made of Amalgamated Dairies Limited who has sponsored our Junior Championships in Kensington for over 20 years. BMO Financial Group continues to support our Sectionals as well as our Section STARSkate event, along with several other loyal sponsors.

In closing, I would like to thank each member of the Skate Canada PEI Board over the last four years, who have made my term as Chair an enjoyable one. Each contributed to achieving the goals of our Section either at the Provincial level or within their respective clubs. I've enjoyed seeing skaters develop and achieve their goals, and look forward to what the next several years will bring for our Organization. Good luck to Mary Ellen and her team.

Coach's Representative Report

This year we had 15 coaches registered with the PEI section. We also had 4 coaches registered to coach powerskating only. Because the police record checks were all completed last year this years registration process was much easier than last year.

One big change this year was with the coaching budget. In the past coaches who have taken a course to increase their coaching level or knowledge have been offered \$100 toward the cost of the course. Many of the courses that coaches are taking range upwards of \$300 and are often out of province. It was decided that coaches would receive 40% of the registration fee of their course. There were 5 coaches who attended a seminar with Micheal Slipchuck in Moncton regarding the new judging system. These coaches received funding for this as well as Brynne Sinclair-Walters who received funding for attending her Level 1 Phase 3 course in Nova Scotia.

It was suggested at last year's AGM that the coaches and judges get together to discuss the standards for skating skills tests as there was an obvious need for communication in this area. As recommended, Shannon and myself organized a skills seminar where skaters demonstrated the skating skills while the coaches evaluated. This seminar was well attended and the coaches found it to be informative.

Once again this year the section brought in a dance partner to work with our higher level dancers. This was a great opportunity for our skaters and we the coaches would certainly like to see it again. We would like to see it combined with a seminar if possible to help cut down on the cost to skaters.

Our Island coaches were well represented at the Canada Games. There were four coaches who attended the games and they certainly had a wonderful experience.

I updated 5 coaches ID tags this year. This continues to be a yearly process as tags are no longer valid when First Aid expires.

In closing I would like to thank all clubs and volunteers who hosted competitions this year. A special thank you to Pownal Club for providing the coaches with a room at STAR Competition. This was greatly appreciated as they were very long days for us. I would also like to thank Elizabeth MacKay and Glen Flood for all of their support and advice over the past year.

Evaluator's Report

We had a successful year with club test days. Evident by the test result statistics, coaches and skaters showed great accomplishments this year. At time of writing this report the included statistics are lacking a few test results but will be updated as soon as they are received. It is mostly high test results missing which would show considerable differences here.

Competitive testing was offered at sectionals and STARskate. Present at sectionals were 3 senior competitive and 1 novice competitive judges. One pre-novice test was successfully completed with a passing result from all three judges on the panel. Present at STARskate were 1 senior, 2 novice, 1 pre-novice, and 2 juvenile judges. No competitive tests were attempted. No summary sheets were received for off island attempted tests but from memory 1 junior and 1 novice were attempted- both successfully. Skaters and coaches are encouraged to take advantage of testing opportunities at competition. It is much less costly to attempt these tests when the judges are already here. We should continue to offer competitive testing at sectionals and STARskate because there are generally a number of judges qualified to do the tests. Skate Canada is currently researching alternate methods for competitive testing that could be very successful. When and if these changes will happen is unknown at this point.

Dance week was held again this year. A new partner was brought in from the Toronto area. Not as many tests were attempted, but only higher levels were offered. It was obvious that the girls were working hard at their dances before the arrival of Ed Bahoric. The quality of tests was very good and they should all be proud of their accomplishments. Considering that they had only one lesson and then tested at a high level, the overall quality of performance was very good.

Thank you again to all volunteers who put in countless hours for test days to be successful. Your time is very much appreciated. The paperwork and phone calls involved are endless and your time and effort do not go unnoticed. Every job is important- from test chairs, to music players, ice captains, judges and hospitality providers. Every little contribution is helpful and appreciated. Thank you to all the judges who really pulled their weight this year. Most test days were completed with on island judges who are well qualified and knowledgeable in their disciplines. We are fortunate to have the qualified, dedicated crew that we do. With low numbers of qualified judges everyone really pulled together to cover all the test days.

Two judges took advantage of trial judging opportunities at Skate Dartmouth. Both judges were assigned to events they were qualified for, providing them the opportunity to judge events with large numbers- an invaluable training tool. Both judges were able to experience both OBO and CPC accounting systems (more commonly known as the "old" and the "new" system).

It's been a busy year for clinic leaders, however, we are fortunate enough to have Marc Allain return to the island for a one day juvenile singles clinic to be held on May 5th. He has agreed to return in the fall for the dance and pair portion. Offering the clinic separately may encourage more skaters to attend- they only have to give up one day at a time. This will also make the material learned less overwhelming. These judges will be able to put into practice the skills learned making the second portion an easier transition.

Recreational Skating Report

I became the Recreational Skating Chairperson this year in late October. Due to my late appointment to this position, I was unable to put together as many seminars as previous years, including a Skills Seminar.

On December 10, 2006 a STAR Dance seminar was held at the South Shore Actiplex (Arena), Crapaud. Rob Fraser of Nova Scotia, conducted the seminar and 38 skaters from across the Island attended. The Seminar went from 8:00 am - 12 Noon.

On January 3, 2007 a STAR Freestyle seminar was held at the South Shore Actiplex (Arena), Crapaud. Amy Ouellette, Level 3 coach and choreographer, from New Brunswick and Angela Coady, coach and Technical Specialist, from Nova Scotia conducted the seminar and 57 skaters from across the Island attended. These two coaches held all the on-ice, technical and conditioning sessions for the skaters. The seminar went from 8:00 am - 1:10 pm.

We were very pleased with the instructors for both of these Seminars and thanks to our sponsor, all coaches were able to stay at the Rodd Royalty while in PEI.

In early February, each club was sent a list of P.A.'s and were asked to update the list with the number of 5 and 10 year P.A. pins required. The majority of pins were distributed to clubs at Section Board Meetings. This year one hundred 10 year silver P.A. pins were ordered from Gemini Screen Printing in Charlottetown. Sixteen 10 year Gold P.A. pins still remain and due to the small demand for these pins, no new additional pins were ordered this year.

The STARSkate competition was held at the Pownal Arena on February 23-25, 2007. As a committee member, I was responsible for getting Ice Captains and Runners for all the events. Each Club participating was responsible to send two workers for each event. I would like to thank the volunteers that participated at this event.

Lessons and partnering were made available to higher level dance skaters (Sr. Bronze and up) across PEI. Dance lessons and partnering were given by Rob Fraser of Nova Scotia and Ed Bahoric from Toronto, in the Charlottetown, Sherwood and Summerside regions. Shannon Richards was available to test all skaters in the evenings, with 25 dance tests being tried.

I have enjoyed this year on the board and hope to expand the Seminars offered next year.

Skater Development Committee Report

Competitive Club

Competitive Club provides extra ice-time and enhanced training conditions for skaters across PEI who have passed competitive tests, or are on target to meet the requirements of a competitive test. Six sessions of Competitive Club were held over the 2006-2007 skating season, with 13 skaters registered at the Pre-Preliminary level and up. All sessions were held at the South Shore Actiplex in Crapaud and included one hour of on-ice training and one hour of off-ice conditioning. Two coaches conducted each on-ice session allowing for more focused and smaller group instruction. Coaches included Julie McNeil, Cindy Stavert, Bonnie Woodside and Kim Duffy. Off-ice training included three cardio sessions provided by Gord McNeily and two dance classes instructed by Julia Sauve.

Talent ID Camp

A Talent ID Camp was held on October 7th in O'Leary, with 31 skaters at the Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary levels in attendance. Nine skaters were Talent ID by Karen Preston, National Technical Specialist and feedback from coaches, skaters and parents was very positive. All coaches were mailed feedback from the session and skaters who were Talent ID have been granted automatic acceptance to next year's Talent ID or Fall Training Camp.

Fall Training Camp

A Fall Training Camp was held on October 8th in O'Leary, with 15 skaters at the Junior Bronze level and higher in attendance. Skaters and coaches were given feedback on individual programs and program components from Karen Preston, National Technical Specialist, using the CPC system. Coaches were invited to the camp and all were given written feedback about skaters' performance.

Sectionals

The 2007 BMO Financial Group Sectional Championships was held in Crapaud and this year included a Pee Wee Ladies event. The BMO Financial Group Merit Award was presented to Denise Davison and is given to a skater who "exemplified the most deserving performance during the BMO Financial Group Skate Canada Sectionals". This award was chosen by a selection committee comprised of the Skater Development Chair, one judge and one technical specialist.

Eastern Challenge

Six skaters represented PEI at the 2006 BMO Financial Group Eastern Challenge held in Moncton, on November 30 - December 3, 2006. Our Pre-Novice Ladies placed 24th, 25th, 29th and 31st and our Novice Ladies placed 28th and 31st.

Private Dance Lessons

Three skaters received private dance lessons from Rob Fraser, nationally accredited coach, after the STAR Dance Seminar held in Crapaud, during the month of December. Lessons were made available to all Gold and Diamond level skaters across the island and ice time was subsidized by the Section.

U-Fit Tickets

Fifty U-Fit tickets were made available to all Competitive, Canada Games, Competitive Club and

Talent ID skaters. Tickets were \$4.00 each, with 50% of the cost subsidized by the Section.

Competitive, Canada Games and Competitive Club skaters were also invited to attend more athlete focused training sessions, offered by Gord McNeily to various sporting groups. These sessions were held once a week over a 20 week period, at a cost of two tickets or \$8.00 per class.

Funding

Off-Island Funding:

Off-Island funding provides assistance to skaters for off-island training which supports each skater in their own personal skater development. The deadline for Off-Island funding was November 30, 2006. Five applications were received and funding was awarded to all those who applied. One skater received the minimum amount of \$300, two skaters received \$375, one skater received \$500 and one skater qualified for \$875. Skaters who attended Competitive Club in the 2005-06 season received an additional \$25 per week in funding, for up to a maximum of eight weeks.

Eastern Challenge:

Funding in the amount of \$300 was given to all skaters who qualified for and attended the 2007 BMO Financial Group Eastern Challenge Championships.

CPC Monitoring Session:

Funding was made available to all skaters with a competitive test who attended the CPC Monitoring Session held in Moncton in August 2006. Five skaters applied and received \$175 each in developmental funds.

Canada Winter Games Training Team

Several Canada Winter Games Training sessions were held over the 2006-2007 skating season. Most sessions took place at the South Shore Actiplex in Crapaud and consisted primarily of on-ice training coached by Julie MacNeil, Head Coach, Michelle Coyle, Assistant Coach and Krista MacKay, Apprentice Coach. One Special Olympic skater also trained with the team and was coached by Kim Duffy. The entire team, including Team Manager Barb Mayhew attended the Canada Winter Games in Whitehorse during the first week of March, 2007.

Thanks to everyone who helped in the planning and organization of many of these events and to the training professionals who committed time to the development of our island skaters.

This year our club had a membership of 70, but with only 30 of these being CanSkaters things continue to be a challenge for us. To meet the rising costs of ice time and other expenses we have had to be very creative in fund-raising efforts over the last year.

These efforts included four new and very successful initiatives including a weekly Goldrush style draw, a Christmas ice pageant and a corporate ice time sponsorship program. Our most successful new fundraiser this year however was our end of year Skate A Thon which was held overnight on March 31 and April 1. Forty three people participated with about twenty of these staying on their skates over the eleven hours of the event (rules were that one skater from each team -maximum of 4 - had to be on the ice at all times). Other fund-raising events included our annual booth at the Canada Day celebrations in Rustico, the annual raffle draw, spring basket draw and Spring Ice Show. We also continued to receive great support from the community as several local non-profit organizations continue to support us in a big way. Due to these efforts we are pleased to say that our club is now in a stronger financial situation than it was at this time last year.

This year's Ice Show was held on March 11th with the theme "Finding Nemo and Friends Splashtacular". It was perhaps a smaller show than in other years but received very positive feedback from those who attended. The rink looked great as a coral reef thanks to the efforts of Mrs. MacNeill's Grade 5/6 class at Gulf Shore School who painted all of the scenery for us as a community project.

The CanPower Program continued to be a strong program for us. Although numbers are down slightly for this year interest is very strong in the community and surrounding areas. We are hopeful that with a bit of work CanPower can become more than just a break even type of program for us. This year the coaches were Club Pro Laura Lannan, Ryan MacEwen, Andrew MacEwen and Alan Crane. Two sessions were held (October to December and January to March) with the first session being slightly more popular than the second.

Laura Lannan continued as Club Pro this year. She continued her upgrading this year working on her Level II certification.
