REGISTRATION

Clubs must submit a summary registration form to the Section via email, by midnight of Saturday, **January 9, 2021**. The acceptance of late entries is at the discretion of the Section in consultation with the Technical Representative.

IMPORTANT: This competition is held in alignment with the PEI STARSkate Championships and therefore a skater cannot skate in the same discipline at both competitions.

Registration numbers will be used to formulate the best COVID cohort option to limit any potential community spread and follow CPHO guidelines.

REGISTRATION FEES

Registration fees for all events must be paid to the skater's home club. Please follow your home club directions. All payments from Clubs will be received post-event to limit refunds if event is cancelled due to COVID.

REFUND POLICY

After the registration closing date, refunds will only be issued for medical reasons with a doctor's note or in relation to COVID self-isolation requirements with connections to a positive test.

ACCREDITATION FOR COACHES

Coaches must meet the following accreditation standards:

- be a current professional coaching member in Good Standing with Skate Canada
- hold a Regional in-training certification or higher

MUSIC

All programs (STAR 2, 3, 4) must be skated to music. Programs are to be skated in harmony with the music chosen by the competitor. Music for all disciplines may contain vocals.

Clubs/Coaches will be responsible for submitting all music to the Section office by February 12, 2020 via USB or online transfer.

Clubs/Coaches must bring an ipod with all the music for their skaters to the competitive venue as a back-up option.

AWARDS

For Star 1-3 events - Ribbons will be provided based on the standard achieved. There will be no award presentations this year. More information on ribbons and report cards will be provided to the club reps and coaches once a schedule is confirmed.

STAR 4 events – Elements will be scored to Standard (Merit, Bronze, Silver and Gold) with pseudo ranking for each flight of skaters with medals awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

All registrants and their guardian(s) understand that participation and spectating in this skating competition is voluntary, and involves inherent risk during participation, including the risk of possible accidents, physical injury, or exposure to the COVID-19 virus or other infections or infectious diseases as a result of attending training, club events or competitive events. By agreeing to this entry, the Guardian(s) and participant(s) freely accept and fully assume all such risks, dangers and hazards, including but not limited to personal injury, disease transmission, death, property damage or loss, resulting from my participation. All participants and spectators agree to carefully read through the operational plan and guidelines to consider the risks involved and have full confidence that reasonable precautions will be taken to ensure the safety and well-being of myself (or my son/daughter/ward).

EVENT SCHEDULE

A finalized schedule of events and start orders will be published on the Skate Canada PEI section website (www.skatecanadapei.com) and a notification will be provided to club representatives.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

- (1) Be Skate Canada PEI registrants in good standing.
- (2) **TEST AND AGE PRE-REQUISITES:** Competitors shall meet the test requirements to compete before **October 1** preceding the competition.
- (3) Skaters may skate up if desired. However, skaters can only compete in one level per event.

EVENTS TO BE HELD

The following events will be offered:

(1) **FREE SKATE EVENTS**

The following sections contain ONLY the specifications and eligibility requirements. For specific technical information please refer to the 2020-21 STAR Program Requirements Guide on the [Skate Canada PEI website](#).

(a) **STAR 1 Element Assessment**

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. Elements assessed to standard. A DRAW for Circle Stroking exercise will be made for each group at ice level.

(b) **STAR 2 Compulsory Assessment Program**

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. One program of a maximum 2:10 minutes in length.

(c) **STAR 3 Free Skate Program**

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds).

(d) **STAR 4 Free Skate Program**

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds). Three age categories may be used if numbers warrant: U10, U13 and 13&O.
