**Standard for Coaches:** Coaches must be NCCP Regional Coach In-Training and be a paid Skate Canada member for the current year and in good standing.

**Age Verification:** Birth certificates may be required. It is recommended that the Team Manager be in possession of the birth certificates to verify the age of a team member in case of dispute. The Team Manager will certify that the dates of birth upon registration.

**Cancellation of Event:** The host committee reserves the right to cancel any event due to insufficient entries.

**Registration:** Team Managers must register all team members by deadline date, December 12, 2021. There will be a \$20 fee per category charged for failing to submit PPC or MP3 file by the deadlines stated. Teams will not be permitted to register at the competition until this fee has been paid and a PPC sheet along with a MP3 music file has been submitted.

**Planned Program Sheet:** Planned Program Content must be submitted online by January 2, 2022. Note: it can be submitted at the same time as registration.

**Music:** Music (MP3 file) must be submitted online no later than January 2, 2021. One CD or USB must be submitted at the time of registration. Music should be clearly labeled on the CD as well as the case, indicating the name of the team, the event and music length. CD/USB's should be picked up as soon as possible after the event.

**SCORING:**

1. Pre-Juvenile to Adult III categories will be marked in CPC for their programs and each team will receive a report card. Skill and cheer will be marked in OBO. All marks will be compiled in the OBO system at the end of the event for a final result for each team.
2. Beginner and Elementary teams will be assessed to a standard for their program and will receive an overall assessment of Gold, Silver, Bronze or Merit. Elementary teams will receive a ranking based on their assessment to standard (as per the STAR 4 events). Skills and cheer, for Beginner and Elementary, will also be assessed to a



standard and teams will receive an overall assessment of Gold, Silver, Bronze or Merit. There will be no ranking for Elementary for the skills and cheer.



**NOTE:** There will be a draw for skating positions done by the host committee and data specialist for each part of this event. This will be done prior to the event and posted in the arena.

**SCHEDULE:** A schedule will be forwarded to each team manager as soon as possible after the closing date. Such schedule will also be available at [www.skatecanadapei.ca](http://www.skatecanadapei.ca).

## **AWARDS:**

### Ribbons:

- Beginner I teams will be presented a gold, silver, bronze, or merit ribbon for each event based on assessment to standard.
- Beginner II teams will be presented a gold, silver, bronze, or merit ribbon for each event
- Elementary teams will be presented a gold, silver, bronze, or merit ribbon for the skills and cheer events.

### Medals:

Elementary Freeskate category: teams will be ranked based on their assessment and medals shall be presented to the top three teams.

Pre-Juvenile to Adult III categories: medals shall be presented to the top three teams. These placements consist of combined marks from all three events. In the case of only one or two entries, each entry shall be awarded a prize.

All presentations will be held on the ice surface.

## **TEAM SPIRIT AWARD**

An award will be presented to the team who exhibits Team Spirit. A committee comprised of three members will select the recipient of this award based on the criteria noted below.

### Criteria:

- Spirit is consistent both throughout the team and also throughout the competition in attitude, appearance, originality, and depth.
- The team displays obvious enthusiasm – in supporting teams, appearance, interactions with teams/Judges, etc. – at the competition.
- They demonstrate spirit as a unified team.



## EVENTS:

There will be three categories of events, and each team participates in all three categories.

### CATEGORY 1 - Team Cheer

Teams will perform their team cheer, on ice, and it will not exceed 90 seconds in length. There will be no props or skating. Marks will be given for originality, creativity, unison and enthusiasm. The team will practice once towards the audience. They then turn and perform for the judges.

### CATEGORY 2 – Skills Competition

A skill will be drawn at ice surface as teams enter the ice surface. The skills will be drawn from the list below. All teams will enter ice surface and line up at boards until their team is called to practice and then to skate the skill for competition. All teams will then exit the ice surface. Teams will have an opportunity to practice the skill twice. Each team will be judged on the skill demonstrated.

## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

For more information visit Skate Canada's team composition rules. Any team entered in an age-restricted category for which they are not age-qualified shall be disqualified and not permitted to change categories after the start of the competition. Entry fees shall not be refunded.

- ✓ All team managers and chaperones must be current Skate Canada registrants.
- ✓ Two coaches, one team manager and two chaperones for a total of five people per team will be accredited. The names and Skate Canada numbers for these accreditations MUST be included on the online registration form.
- ✓ The main coach and one alternate (skater) will stand at the entrance to the ice, and the team manager and other alternates in the exit area.
- ✓ The chaperones will be allowed in the dressing rooms ONLY and will not have access to ice level during practice and competition (including Kiss & Cry).
